#### Presentation

# Andrew Lewis, PA House of Representatives, 105th District

- Gary Myers introduced Representative Lewis.
- Representative Lewis updated us on his first few months as a Representative.
- He shared his enthusiasm for working with other House members to return government to the people.
- He shared that he believes in a "government of the people," where public officials serve the citizens and not themselves.

- Lewis shared his background: after graduating high school and before joining the family construction business he enlisted in the Army where he served for almost 10 years on active duty. He spent 15 months in Iraq as a scout during the troop surge from 2007 08.
   Subsequently, Andrew was selected to become an Army counterintelligence agent and was assigned to South Korea for a two-year tour.
- At the age of 23, Andrew was appointed special agent in charge of his counterintelligence team in Korea, overseeing all counterintelligence operations for his assigned area.
- After two years in Korea, he was nominated by the Department of Defense to serve at the White House Communications Agency, where Andrew served as both an assistant presidential communications officer, and as chief of the agency's Information Security Branch.
- He continues to serve in the Pennsylvania National Guard, drilling every month at Fort Indiantown Gap.
- He has introduced an amendment enacting term limits and his focus will be reforming government and rooting out corruption in Harrisburg.
- Representative Lewis serves on the Finance, Liquor Control, State Government, and Urban Affairs Committees. He is Secretary of the Urban Affairs Committee.
- Representative Lewis is a co-sponsor of the Municipal Debt Reform Bill.
- He addressed a question about Prevailing Wage and agrees that it should be removed, but he
  doesn't see much movement on it in the legislature.
- Lewis was accompanied by Eric Rivers, his District Constituent Outreach Specialist.

#### **Consent Agenda**

March 2019 Minutes - Jim Fisher made motion. Robert Charles seconded. Unanimously approved. March 2019 Treasurer's Report -Charles made motion. Fisher seconded. Unanimously approved.

#### **Executive Director's Report**

- 39th Annual Surplus Equipment and Vehicle Auction July 17, 2019.
  - There is a change in venue to Good Hope Middle School due to construction at Sporting Hill Elementary School over the summer.
  - Change in large equipment/vehicles this year 90% to municipalities and 10% to CapCOG vs. 80%/20%. CapCOG will be charging a buyers' fee to compensate for the change.
  - The Auction has been our major fundraiser for 38 years.
- Myers encouraged members to consider working with Dan Cohen to develop Wireless Ordinances. Cohen has lowered the payment fees for participation.

#### **County and Planning Commission Reports**

Cumberland County - Commissioner Jim Hertzler presented.

- Land Partnership Grant Program application is open through June 21, 2019. Interested municipalities should contact the Cumberland County Planning Department.
- The first household hazardous waste recycling event will be on July 18, 2019 from 12 to 6 at the Cumberland County Recycling Center. Appointments are required. Cost is .30/lb.
- The Cumberland County Planning Commission's 2018 Annual Report and Growth Trends report is available through the Planning Department.

Dauphin County - No report.

York County - Mark Ryder

- York County is going to announce a plan to enhance water quality monitoring around the county as opposed to creating a stormwater authority in the next two weeks or so.
- Moving forward on the new state-mandated voting machines and will have the system deployed in the November election.

#### **CPJTF - Rhonda Campbell**

- Kyle Kreiser and Steve Moore from PennDOT District 8 attended to discuss the Meck's Corner project and Routes 274 and 849 needs.
- Attendees identified trouble areas on Routes 274 and 849 on a map which Kreiser will take back to PennDOT for consideration in upcoming improvement schedules. Major areas of focus were Duncannon where 322 and 11/15 intersect with 274, Bloomfield Square, and intersection of 74/274 near the West Perry High School.
- Meck's Corner: field surveys are complete and the next step is design. A roundabout isn't
  probably for this location. The project is in the engineering phase in this TIP. It will move to
  construction phase in next TIP with a target completion date of 2023.
