President Nate Silcox called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm. He then led the pledge to the flag.

Round Table Introductions were made.

Nate asked for any edits, changes or questions on the consent agenda items of minutes and treasurer's report. Hearing none, he called for a motion to approve. Moved by Bob Charles, seconded by Rick Schin, and, approved unanimously.

Presentation:

State Fire Commissioner Tim Solobay spoke about key areas affecting Pennsylvania fire departments including, training-which is available online for seven disciplines, recruiting volunteers, funding equipment, Foreign Fire Relief pension, etc. SB370 is pending legislation to give monies to companies that wish to regionalize. Regionalization is being considered as a way to assist, and several fire companies have merged or created partnerships. Commissioner Solobay referred to the study *The Feasibility of Regionalizing Pennsylvania's Volunteer Fire Companies* which was written in 2005. Ann will get more copies and have them available for members.

Executive Director's Report - A written report was presented at the meeting and is included with the minutes In addition, Ann mentioned the new solicitor for UCC appeals is Dan Altland, with approval of the Executive Committee. Mr Haas took a position with the PUC as a Judge. Also, the Local Government Advisory Committee for the Chesapeake Bay met and reviewed the Management Strategies. A measureable baywide is to install 2400 acres of trees by 2025. More on Urban Tree Canopy will be publicized in the coming years.

Old Business:

Update on CapCOG Chesapeake Bay Pollutant Reduction Plan (CBPRP)

Six members are participating in the program. Due to the decrease in numbers, the base price of \$120,000 was reduced to \$100,000.
